- 1) Identify suitable grants, tender opportunities and income generating projects and ideas which might support the delivery of Tir Coed's activities and the development of our organisation
- 2) Work with the management team to deliver and develop the fund-raising strategy





- 3) Develop, carry out research for and regularly update our database of funding opportunities, specifications, contacts, deadlines etc
- 4) Write/complete/contribute to grant applications, expressions of interest and bids
- 5) Write/complete/contribute to outcomes reports
- 6) Network and develop connections with trust funds and other funder networks
- 7) Manage Tir Coed's activity on the Sell2Wales portal
- 8) Develop Tir Coed's legacy and other individual giving plans
- 9) Report on a monthly and quarterly basis on progress against targets
- 10) Develop appropriate fundraising templates
- 11) Ensure that all relevant Tir Coed plans, policies and procedures are being adhered to; and input into their development and review

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Salary:

The salary is £23K-£24K pro rata and is paid monthly in arrears.

Hours:

This is a part-time post based on 15 hours per week (2 days). Flexible working may be agreed by arrangement. If attendance on a non-working day is required in addition to normal working hours, time off in lieu may be given. These hours may increase over time.

Annual Leave:

The post holder will have pro rata of 20 days annual leave a year, plus bank holidays.

Probation Period:





A Probation period of 6 months will apply, ending with a meeting with the CEO/Executive Officer and/or the Chairman of Trustees to ensure the post-holder is right for the post.

Location:

Location of the post will be our Aberystwyth Office. Some travel within the region and occasionally further afield will be expected.

Travel and Subsistence:

Where staff are required to travel by road on official business outside of travel to normal work locations, there will be provision of a mileage allowance of 40p per mile for the use of a private vehicle.
